4 Make sure to thank your bridal party, family and also guests that traveled a far distance in your ceremony program.

5 Traditionally, it is the Groom's duty to give thanks aloud to the guests at your wedding reception, not the Bride.

6 It is my opinion that your 'thank you' gifts for your bridal party should be the same expense as their required wedding attire. Example; if your bridesmaid dresses cost \$200, then that is how much you need to spend on each of their gifts. Remember, these are your best friends and most likely they have done a lot up till now.

7 Thank you notes should be sent out as soon as possible. Although etiquette says you have up to a year. Your thank you note will seem more sincere if it is sent out in a timely manner.

8 How will you thank your parents? In private? At the rehearsal dinner? During the ceremony? However you choose, make sure that it is special and meaningful to them.

9 Don't let your thank you notes pile up! It is easiest if you write them as soon as you receive a gift. It also really helps if you get super cute thank you notes because you will be excited to send them!

10 Thank your vendors! They are the reason that your wedding will go off without a hitch! A little note of appreciation along with final payment (and optional tip) is the perfect way to say thanks.
