- Your wedding invitation is the first impression your guests have of your big day, what impression will yours make?

- Registry info should NEVER be on or anywhere close to your wedding invitation.



- Your wedding theme should be carried through your entire event, from your invites to your thank you cards.
 - Postage can add up quickly, most invites start at \$.64 to mail. Make sure to include that in your invite budget.
- Save-the-Dates = 6 months before your wedding day. Wedding Invites = 8 - 10 weeks before your wedding.

- Make a special spot in your home to collect all your rsvp cards. Like a cute basket or box, then they will all be in one safe place.
- Compiling all your guests addresses can be very stressful. The groom should be responsible for his side and the bride for her side.
- Unfortunately guests will forget to write their names on your rsvp cards. To avoid frustration, you can discreetly number each RSVP card so you know exactly whose it is.
- Think fun and unique! What personal touch can you add to your invitations to make them standout? Calligraphy? Vintage Postage? Special trinket? Funny RSVP card? A giant map like above?
