1 Your wedding invitation is the first impression your guests have of your big day, what impression will yours make?

2 Looking for something unique? Etsy artisans have lots to offer, like this one from Ello There!

3 Registry info should *NEVER* be on or anywhere close to your wedding invitation.



4 Your wedding theme should be carried through your entire event, from your invites to your thank you cards.

5 Postage can add up quickly, most invites start at \$.64 to mail. Make sure to include that in your invite budget.

6 Save-the-Dates = 6 months before your wedding day.
Wedding Invites = 8 - 10 weeks before your wedding.

7 Make a special spot in your home to collect all your rsvp cards. Like a cute basket or box, then they will all be in one safe place.

8 Compiling all your guests addresses can be very stressful. The groom should be responsible for his side and the bride for her side.

9 Unfortunately guests will forget to write their names on your rsvp cards. To avoid frustration, you can discreetly number each RSVP card so you know exactly whose it is.

10 Think fun and unique! What personal touch can you add to your invitations to make them stand out? Calligraphy? Vintage Postage? Special trinket? Funny RSVP card? A giant map like above?
